<b>Academics</b>	<p>Classes are finishing up their mid-year benchmarks in iReady.</p> <p>Preliminary scores are showing consistencies in growth matching student engagement in virtual learning. We have a way to go to make up for lost learning last year.</p> <p>A committee for competency-based education was established to plan instruction for the coming school year. Our goal is to develop a framework for instruction that will allow students to work on skill deficits, create more individualized education plans for students, and to determine what professional development and support teachers will need in order to successfully address the learning deficits caused by school closures and remote learning.
