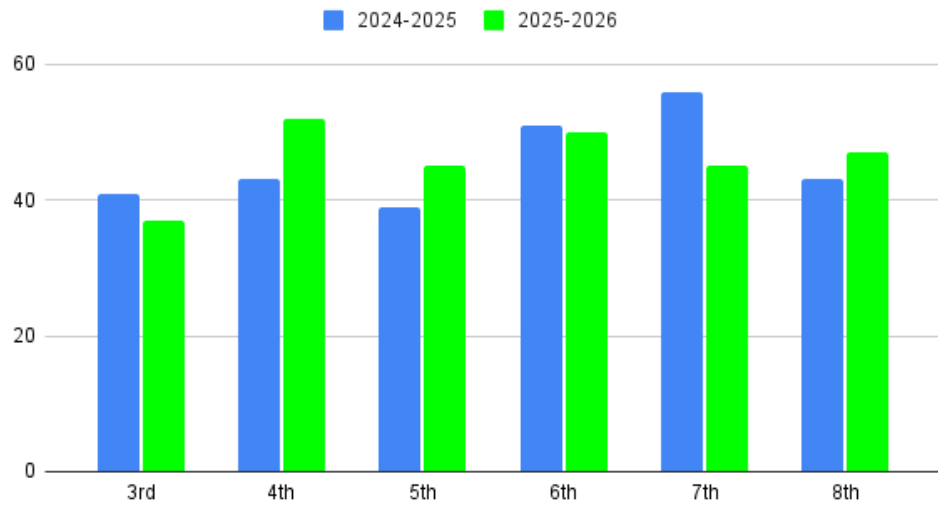

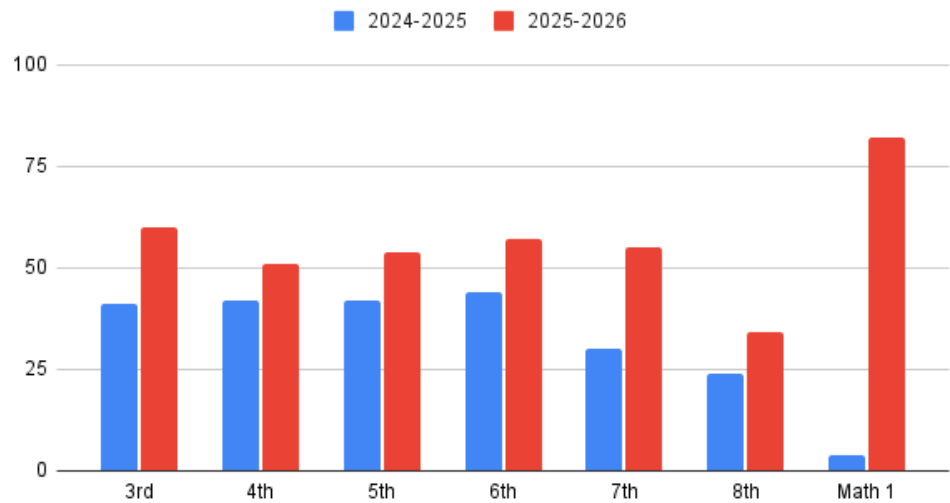

Academics	• All MOY MVPA (formerly Case21) data is complete. Based on our review of the data, we are seeing an overall improvement over last year's BOY data. We attribute this to a strong opening to the school year focusing on the Get Better Faster coaching model, staffing changes and our continuous professional development. • As noted on our data report our 3rd grade reading score is lower than we would like to see but tracks with end of year data from 2nd grade. Our plan is to target 3rd grade by adding additional support during reading block and offering targeted after school tutoring. We will offer similar support for 7th grade ELA students. • We are proud of the work our teachers did this year to stay on pacing. No teacher skipped any of the standards on our current pacing. This sets us up to continue on pace and provide reteaching and spiral review opportunities for weak standards. • Outstanding performance was noted in science, both grades already surpassing last year's EOG.

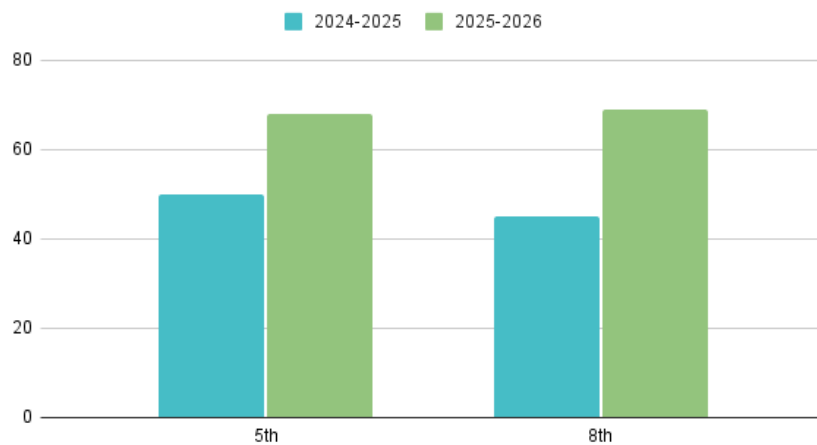
MVPA Reading Comparison



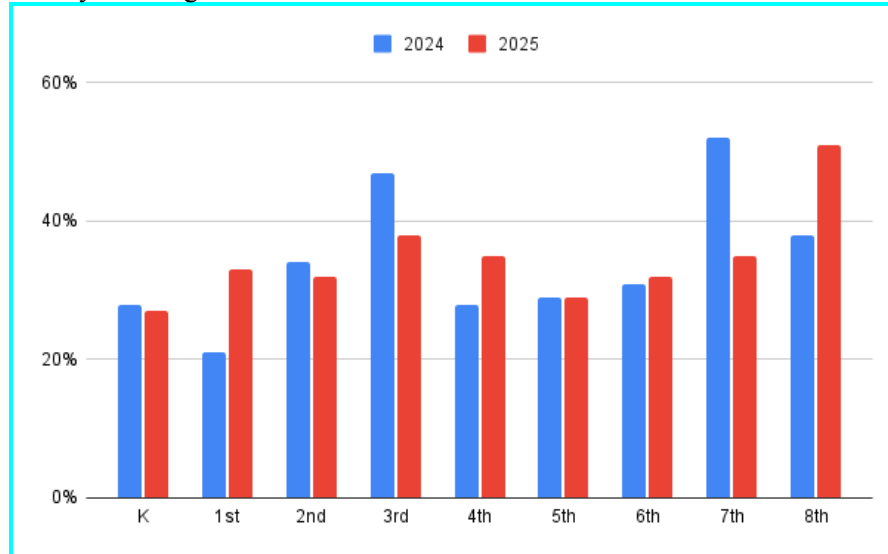
MVPA Math Comparison



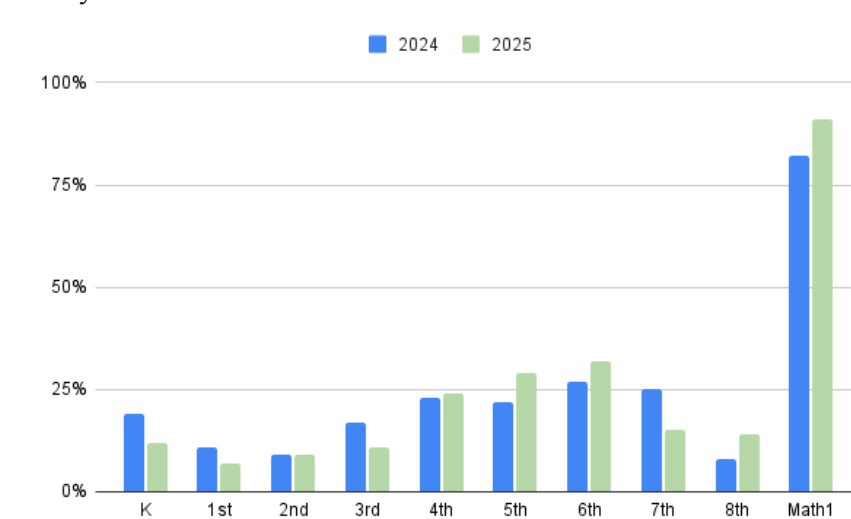
MVPA Science Comparison

- iReady assessments took place in the first weeks of school giving us strong baseline data which we used primarily to begin our intervention groups during Titan Time.
- This year we added extra support during the 2nd grade reading block and are working with teachers during data chats and PLC to build capacity in the science of reading and supporting strong instructional practices.
- We made a strong push from the beginning of the year to support students in meeting the instructional minutes recommended by iReady to ensure growth. This is done by incentivizing usage with a themed challenge, recognition and prizes. Families are encouraged to support at home when they can. Our iReady usage is up and we expect to see significant growth after the January assessment period.
